1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

College adopt the curriculum overview provided by the Kerala University. Depending on our resource potentiality, institutional goals and concern towards the students, we impart quality education. The institution has developed a structured and effective implementation of the curriculum. Following are the various means through which it executives the curriculum.

• College council Meetings including all HoDs are frequently held once in 10 to 12 days. Headof the Departments discuss

- their action plans to arrive at an optimal and effective way.
- Academic Calendar is prepared as per Kerala University academic calendar schedule and the requirements at the department level as per the action plans formed.
- A Lesson plan includes course outcomes, course objectives, content topics, reference books and the expected outcomes from the students by learning through the topics is prepared by respective faculty members at the beginning of each semester. It gives an insight towards how the lecture class will be handled throughout the semester.
- Each department functions accordingly with the Institutional Vision and Mission. Educational Objectives and Outcomes are developed for each program and Course Objectives and course outcomes are defined for each course (theory and lab)

### 1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The choice based semester system is adopted for all UG programmes. The affiliated UG programmes are termed as First Degree Programme by Kerala University. The PG programmes are also framed under semester system. The University offers a common academic calendar for both UG and PG programmes for its affiliated colleges. By following the same academic calendar, each department in our college frame a department time table.

For UG courses, out of 100 marks for each course, University examinations conduct for 80 marks and the remaining 20 marks are evaluated through internal continuous assessment, so calledCA marks. For PG, out of 100 marks for each course, 75 marks are for university examination and the remaining 25 marks are evaluated through CA marks.

For UG, CA mark distribution is as follows

Attendance out of 5

Assignment out of 5

#### Test out of 10

Those students who attend 100% classes for the respective course will secure 5 marks. Those students who attend 50 % classes will get 1 mark. However, a minimum 75% marks are required for registering the University examination.

The students should submit assignments for each courses during the semester. Neatly written assignment with sufficient contents will get 5 marks.

The class tests, internal tests and a model internal examinations are conducted at every semester end for all courses. The marks secured by each student for respective courses are then converted into out of 10 and that mark will be provided as their test for for CA.

For UG practicals in science subjects, the CA mark distribution includes Attendance (5), record (5), skill and punctuality (5), test (5)

For PG, the CA mark distribution is as follows

Attendance (5), Assignment (5), Seminar (5), Test (10)

For PG practicals, the distribution is as follows

Attendance (5), Record (10), Test (10)

In department calendar, the schedules for submission of assignments, conduct of class seminars (for PG only), conduct of class test, internal exams and model exams are mentioned. Also, the schedule for declaring CA marks and CA mark upload to University are mentioned. The department level monitoring committee (DLMC) including HoD, Tutor and courses handling teachers are engaged in CA mark preparation. The college level Monitoring committee including Principal, CLMC convener, All HoDs and tutors monitorthe CA marks scrutiny and the final upload to University. Tutors , so called course advisers submit verified CA marks to Hod level. The HoD verifies the same and if is alright forwards to Principal level or n otherwise in case of any defects return to advisor level for resubmission. In the Principal level, CLMC scrutinize the CA marks and if it is alright, with the permission of Principal, submit the CA marks to University. In case of any defects, rejects the same to HoD level.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The college ensures optimal allocation and utilization of the available financial resources for maintenance and upkeep of different facilities by holding regular meetings of various committees constituted for this purpose and using the grants received by the college as per the requirements in the interest of students. Laboratory Record of maintenance account is kept by lab technicians and supervised by HoDs of the concerned departments. The calibration, repairing and maintenance of sophisticated lab equipments are done by the technicians of related owner enterprises. The microscopes used for biological and physical sciences related experiments are annually cleaned and maintained by the concerned departments and record of maintenance is kept by lab technicians and supervised by HoDs of the concerned departments. There is systematic disposal of waste of all types such as biodegradable chemical /and ewaste. In the Library, the requirement and list of books is taken from the concerned departments. The finalized list of required books is duly approved and signed by the Principal. Suggestion box is installed inside the reading room to obtain users feedback. Their continuous feedback helps a lot in introducing new ideas regarding library enrichment. To ensure return of books, 'no dues' from the library is mandatory for students before appearing in exam. The proper account of visitors (students and staff) on daily basis is maintained. Other issues such as weeding out of old titles, schedule of issue/ return of books etc are chalked out / resolved by the library committee. Sports: During the session 2020-21 college won many sports items . Department of Physical Education conducted separate coaching camps for men and women in various sports and games.

Computer maintenance through AMC/ or by means of PTA is done regularly and non repairable systems are disposed off.

Class rooms: The RDC of the college take care of infrastructure

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developments for class rooms. A RUSA fund is allotted for infrastructure development. #### Admission of Students

Admission of students is done as per the guideline provided by the University. The nature of admission include Merit, reservation category (SC/ST), Community based quota, Sports quota and management quota. In addition one seat is reserved for PWD (Physically challenged) candidates and transgender candidates in each subject. Each programme has an assigned sanctioned strength of students. As per the norms of Government, University provides a marginal increment of seats for each programmes in consultation with the decision made by college level admission committee and college council. The whole admission procedure is online single window mode.

#### Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The industrial chemistry department and Commerce department made some industrial link for completing curriculum project work for students.

#### Human Resource Management

Teaching, non teaching and part time staff were optimally utilized for the wide interest in upgrading the college by scheduled scheme of work assignments. For permanent teachers, apart from teaching (including valuation/examination duties) work load, additional administrative and extension duties were assigned through proper channel management. Guest faculty members were given full assigned teaching responsibility, including examination and valuation. Faculty members had sent proposals to various funding agencies to avail research grants. TARE fellowship is awarded to one faculty. Four research guides are already there. New research students were registered under faculty members having research guideship in

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university of Kerala. A number of papers were published in various disciplines by different faculty members. MSc and BSc projects were done by utilizing the department level limited in house research facilities and through links with reputed national Institutes.

#### Examination and Evaluation

Regular internal and model examinations were conducted in a centralized mode. The internal examinations papers were timely evaluated and considered for class assessment mark, which is added to the university examination result. The university examination cell is equipped to meet the needs recommended by Kerala University to conduct examinations. The result analysis has been done in department wise and discussed in college council and CLMC to find ways for improvements.

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as per the norms provided by Government of Kerala, University of Kerala and UGC. The Interview board is constituted with subject experts, Government Nominee andManagement representative. Subsequently, the rank list will be published and the Manager will then appoint the top ranked candidatesto fill the vacancies. The appointment should then be approved by the University and Directorate of Collegiate education. The latest 7 th UGC pay scale and Kerala State Service rule is applicable for teaching staff members.

Non teaching staff appointment is also performed by SN Trusts. The Manager will appoint the top ranked candidates to fill the vacancies and the appointment should then be approved by directorate of collegiate education. The latest Kerala State Scale and Kerala Service rule is applicable for non-teaching staff.

The tenure track Guest faculties are appointed by Manager in each year to fill the existing teaching vacancies. An interview will be conducted in presence of Principal, subject expert and management representative. The top ranked candidates will be appointed by Manager to fill the vacancies. The appointment should then be approved by deputy directorate of collegiate education.

A part-time law lecturer is also there, appointed by Manger in existing procedures.

Also, temporary management /PTA staff members are there in non teaching sector.

The Principal interview is conducted by as per the norms in latest UGC regulation 2018. A selection committee including Government as well as University representatives and Manager/representative will conduct the interview. From the rank list the top ranked candidates will be appointed as Principal. Associate Professor having academic credentials as per UGC regulation 2018 can apply for Principal post. The appointment of Principal should also be approved by University and directorate of Collegiate Education.

Assistant Professors in academic level 10 (entry cadre) shall be placed to level 11 after completion of 6 years of services (four years for PhD candidates and 5 years for M.Phil candidates). As per UGC regulation 2018, during the period a four weeks orientation/induction programme and a two weeks refresher course are mandatory. Also minimum satisfactory grades in teaching, cocurricular activities are mandatory.

After completion of five years of service in level 11 cadre, the teachers will be placed to Assistant Professor academic level 12. As per UGC regulations 2018, two refresher courses, each of two weeks is mandatory to be completed during the period. Two short term courses of 5 days each is equivalent to a refresher course. Along with this, minimum satisfactory grades in teaching, co-curricular activities are mandatory.

There after 3 years of service in academic level 12, the teacher is eligible to be promoted to Associate Professor, provided all norms for such a promotion as per UGC regulation 2018 is satisfied. A PhD in relevant subject, minimum satisfied grades in teaching, cocurricular activities are mandatory.

On completion on three years as Associate Professor, the teacher will be eligible for promotion as Professor, if the teacher meets all the points recommended by UGC regulation 2018. Ten research papers in care list, of which three papers published after promoted to associate professor is Mandatory. Minimum grade points in teaching, co-curricular and research activities are mandatory.

For placement in Assistant Professor level 11 and 12, a screening committee duly constituted by University including two subject experts, Principal as chairman, HoD and College IQAC coordinator as member is required. The candidate should submit the PBAS along with relevant documents and service record in front of the screening committee. The committee shall verify the credentials and declare the eligibility for placement to next level. The Manager will then issue the placement order which will be further approved by University and deputy directorate of collegiate education.

For promotion as Associate Professor and Professor, University shall constitute a selection committee including two subject experts in Professor level and the Manager/management representative and Principal. The rest of the procedure is same as mentioned in the case of screening committee.

UGC librarians are also having placements as per regulation norms.

The promotion of non teaching staff counts the years and a pass in service level aptitude test. The promotion posts are lab assistant, LD clerk, UD clerk, Head of Accounts and Junior Superintended.
