Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) Annual Activity Report 2020-2021

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Skill Development

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Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP), a joint initiative of General and Higher Education Departments, was launched with an objective to impart quality skill education to the higher secondary / undergraduate students alongside their regular curriculum. Owing to the success of the program, attained over the years, the target group is widened to professional colleges and is now set to kick off community skilling through the Community Skill Parks. ASAP as a skill development agency is to accentuate the employability of the youth and offers domain-specific skill courses in different sectors which are aligned with the NSQF (National Skill Qualification Framework). Courses are selected based on industry demands, which is continuously updated in consultation with the Business Advisory Committees (BAC) formed for different sectors. ASAP gives special edge to those students who are in need of immediate employment. For the needy, ASAP lays out a way to fend a living by ideally placing them in an organization.

Objectives:

- to impart skill based training with the objective of building a pool of skilled personnel.
- to establish a highly potential Quality Assurance mechanism for skill training.

- to enhance the employability of the students graduating from regular academic courses by introducing additional skill programmes along with the curriculum.
- to integrate and scale up the programmes to impart low-end skills as well as to equip semi-skilled / unskilled workforce in a mission mode institutionalized approach.

ASAP offers foundation module as well as skill oriented module to every batches. The foundation module program consists of 180 hours of training for communication skills in English (100 hours) and basic IT skills (80 hours). The training also focuses on the all-round personality development of the students. The skill course involves training in trending Sectors such as media and entertainment, Banking and Finance, Healthcare, Language Development & Life skills, automotive, food processing etc. Duration may vary with each skill course; however, all courses are supported with internships at reputed firms concerned. ASAP also provides placement support to students through its job portal.

Our second batch students (2018-2019) were appeared for APTIS four level exam after the completion of Foundation Module. We hope that our students could achieve commendable result in this year too. Ms. Sreelekshmi P.B, II BSc. Mathematics and Ms. Gopika Suresh, II BSc Mathematics (2019-2020 batch) got selection for District Collector's Fee Sponsorship to APL-General category. Unfortunately, ASAP completely skipped the skill course this year due to the prevailing pandemic situation. Our foundation batch students also got affected by Covid-19. ASAP experimented online classes for few weeks but the classes came into a halt due to the order from ASAP Head Quarters.

Month wise Activity report of Foundation Module:

January 2020

The new ASAP batch of 2019-20 has started on 6th January 2020. In total 13 sessions were taken during January and all of which were that of communicative

English. Through these classes the learners got an overall idea regarding the ASAP classes mode of operation and they were able to build a social self.

February

In the month of February, a total of 9 sessions were taken. The sessions dealt with the central idea of personality development. These sessions motivated the students to speak in front of a crowd without any awe or embarrassment.

March

In March, only 6 sessions were taken and the classes were abruptly stopped in accordance with the prevailing pandemic situation. All the sessions were that of English grammar and it helped the learners to brush up their grammatical skills.

Due to covid-19 pandemic, classes were abruptly stopped by ASAP.

October

The classes were resumed after a long gap of six months. This time the mode of transfer was online. The classes were conducted via Google meet. 10 sessions were taken during this month and all of which incorporated their technical and social skills.

January 2021

Again after a gap of 2 months the classes restarted in January 2021. 6 classes were taken which was also through Google meet and Whatsapp.

After January, the classes came into a halt due to the order from ASAP HQ.

So, in short a total hour of 44 classes were taken and all of them are that of Communicative English module.

FM for 2019-2020 batches have been suspended until further order in accordance with Proceedings of the Chairperson and Managing Director, ASAP, Govt. of Kerala dated 21.05.2021
