



The National Cadet Corps, considered as the world's largest youth organisation, came into existence in India, on 15 July 1948 through the XXXI Act of Parliament with its Head Quarters at New Delhi. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis. The Cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selection based on the achievements of the corps.

MOTTO OF NCC: 'UNITY AND DISCIPLINE'

AIMS OF NCC:

- To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens.
- To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life including the Armed Forces and be always available for the service of the nation.
- To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.

NCC ORGANISATION: The National Cadet Corps is headed by a Director General, an Army Officer of the rank of Lieutenant General, who is responsible for the functioning of the National Cadet Corps in the country through the National Cadet Corps Headquarters situated at Delhi. At the State Level, the country has been divided into 17 Directorates covering all States and Union Territories. Each of the State NCC Directorate Headquarters controls two to fourteen Group Headquarters. NCC Units are commanded by Major/Lieutenant Colonel or their equivalents.
