ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

The College is named after the great social reformer and freedom fighter Sri. T.K. Madhavan who stood for the upliftment of backward classes. He was born and brought up in a prominent Ezhava family in Karthikappally Taluk. From the days of his childhood, he became conscious of the outrageous insults and ill treatment suffered by his fellow beings under the rigours of the caste system. In his youth he became an ardent and faithful follower of Sree Narayana Guru. Inspired by the grand spiritual vision of the Guru, he dedicated his life to the cause of the oppressed masses. He was an admirer of Gandhian philosophy also. The 'Vaikom Satyagraha', organised by him with the blessings of Sree Narayana Guru and Mahatma Gandhi in 1924 was a momentous event in the freedom struggle of India and a turning point in the long struggle for the eradication of untouchability. In deference to the rousing call of the Guru "to be strong through organisation", as the organising secretary of SNDP Yogam, he gave the organisation its present structure and created a mass base. His selfless and relentless striving for the uplift of the downtrodden wrecked him physically and financially. His untimely death at the age of 45 was an irreparable loss to Kerala's reformist movement. We, the people of Kerala, owe him much.

As a tribute to his selfless service to humanity this temple of learning was established in 1964 through the combined efforts of Karthikappally, Karunagappally and Mavelikkara SNDP Unions. Sri. R. Shankar, former Chief Minister of Kerala and the Founder Manager of Sree Narayana Colleges, formally inaugurated the college on July 4, 1964. Like Sri. R. Sankar, Sri. T.K. Madhavan, was also inspired by the edict of the Guru "to be enlightened through education". Sri. R. Sankar's mature vision and pragmatic approach resulted in the establishment of 16 Sree Naryana Colleges through out Kerala that are living monuments of the great Guru. During the last five decades T.K. Madhava Memorial College has carved a niche for itself among this illustrious cluster of institutions.

The mission of the College is to mould young men and women committed to the pursuit of truth, compassion and moral excellence upholding the doctrines of Sree Narayana Guru.

ACADEMICS

First Degree Programmes Under the Choice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS)

The First Degree Programmes include (1) Language Courses, (2) Foundation Courses, (3) Core Courses in the Major Subjects related to Degree Programmes, (4) Complementary Courses on allied subjects, (5) Open Course, (6) Elective Courses and (7) Project/ Dissertation. In the case of Career Related First Degree programmes under CBCSS, there shall be a component of Vocational Course.

1. Semester

Semester means a term consisting of 90 working days distributed over a minimum period of 18 weeks.

2. Course

Course means a portion of a subject to be taught and evaluated in a semester. A course of 4 credits will meet a minimum of 4 hours per week and treated as full course. A semi course of one credit will meet atleast one hour per week in a semester.

3. Language Courses

Language Courses are courses in English and an additional language of students' choice. Students who join for any B.A./B.Sc programme in this college have to study 5 courses in English and 4 courses in additional language.The additional languages offered are Malayalam, Hindi and Sanskrit. Those who join B.Com programme have to study 4 courses in English and 2 courses in additional language.

4. Foundation Courses

Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study one course under language and one course under core. For B.Com

🐼 T.K.M.M. College Nangiarkulangara programme students have to take up both the foundation courses under the core subject.

5. Core Courses

Core course means compulsory course in a main subject related to the First Degree Programme (FDP) in a discipline. Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study compulsory 12-15 core courses and submit one dissertation/project report. For B.Com Programme a student has to attempt 16 core courses and submit one dissertation/project work.

6. Complementary Courses

Complementary Course means a course in a subject other than the major subject and is complementary to the main subject. Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study 8 to 10 complementary courses while for B.Com programme a student has to choose 4 complementary courses.

7. Open/Elective Course

Students who join for B.A./B.Sc. programmes have to study two courses to a minimum of 4 credits and for B.Com Degree programme a student has to study 6 courses to a minimum of 20 credits. Open course means an optional course which the student is free to take at his/her will. Open Course shall be a course offered by the Departments other than the Parent Department. Elective course means a specialized course from the frontier area of core subject.

8. Audit Courses

Courses which student can register without earning credits (Zero Credit Course) and are not compulsory for completing the degree programme. Courses for more than the stated number of credits (120) may be obtained through audit courses.

9. Repeat course

Repeat course is a course that a student repeats if he/she has failed in it. Repeat courses are possible with the next batch for failed candidates. Students who complete the semester, by securing the minimum required attendance and by registering for ESE of each semester alone shall be promoted to higher semester. Students who fail to secure minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one or more chances to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining readmission subjected to the condition that the candidate has to complete the programme in not more than 12 continuous semesters and that the candidate has to appear for CE afresh each time.

10. Credit

Credit of a course is measure of the weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory session or seminar or similar actrivity designed for the course. Each credit hour is roughly equivalent to one hour of class time per week in a semester.

11. Attendance

Students who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation (ESE). Others have to repeat the semester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation. However, the award of Grade for attendance in CE shall be made course-wise. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds. Benefits of attendance for a maximum of 10 days in a semester shall be granted to students who attend to University Union activities, meetings of University bodies and participation in extra curricular activities by treating as present for the days of their absence for the above purpose on production of participation/attendance certificate in such activities issued by the University Authorities/Principal.

12. Social Service/Extension Activities

Social Services and Extension activities are mandatory for all students in 3rd & 4th semester with a minimum attendance of 40 hours. A Student who makes achievement in Sports/Arts/N.C.C./N.S.S. shall get Grace Marks. The College offers the following Social Services and Extension Activities/Clubs.

1. National Cadet Corps (NCC), 2. National Service Scheme (NSS), 3. Nature Club/Eco Club, 4. Sports Club, 5. Health Education, 6. Womens' Study Unit, 7. Debate Club, 8. Literary Club, 9. Media Club, 10. Science Club, 11. Planning Forum, 12. Anti-Ragging Cell, 13. Environmental Activities (Bio Diversity Club)

13. Evaluation

The Evaluation of each Course shall consists of two parts :

1) Continuous Evaluation (CE)

2) End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE for all Courses (Theory and Practical).

Continuous Evaluation (CE)

The marks of CE shall be consolidated by adding the marks of Assignment/Seminar and test paper respectively for a particular Course.

a)	Assignment / Seminar	10 marks
b)	Test Paper	10 marks

Assignments or Seminars (Max. marks 10)

Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each Course. Assignments/Seminars shall be evaluated on the basis of their quality. The teacher shall be similarly evaluated in terms of structure, content, presentation, interaction, etc.

Tests (Max. marks 10)

For each Course there shall be one class tests during a semester. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal within 10 working days from the date of the test.

End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

ESE of all Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be published according to the Examination Calendar prescribed by the University Level Monitoring Committee (ULMC), which shall not exceed 45 days from the last day of the examination. The maximum mark for a Course (ESE theory) is 80. The duration of ESE is 3 hours.

Total marks for the ESE of Practical is 80. The components of ESE of Practical have to be set by the Chairman, Board of Studies, concerned. The marks for the components of Practical for Continuous Evaluation shall be as shown below.

a) Attendance	5 marks
b) Record	5 marks
c) Test	5 marks
d) Performance, Punctuality and Skill	5 marks

Attendance (Max. marks 5):

The allotment of marks for attendance of practicals shall be as follows:

less than 51%	0 Marks
51% to 60%	1 marks
61% to 70%	2 marks
71% to 80%	3 marks
81% to 90%	4 Marks
91% to 100%	5 Marks

The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE (80+20).

A minimum of 35% marks (E Grade) shall be required for passing a Course with a separate minimum of 35% (E Grade) for Continuous Evaluation (CE) End Semester Evaluation (ESE).

Those who fail to secure a pass minimum of 35% (E Grade) for a course will have one chance to improve CE marks for the course.

14. Project/Dissertation Work

For each First Degree programme there shall be a Project/ Disseration Work. The Project/Dissertation work can be done either individually or by a group not exceeding five students. However, Viva-Voce based on the Project/Dissertation work shall be conducted individually. The topics shall either be allotted by the supervising teacher or be selected by the students in consultation with the supervising teacher. The report of the Project/Dissertation shall be submitted to the Department in duplicate before the completion of the sixth semester. There shall be no continuous assessment for Dissertation/project work. A Board of two Examiners appointed by the University shall evaluate the report of the Project/Dissertation work. The Detailed guidelines regarding the conduct and evaluation of the Project/Dissertation will be framed by the Board of Studies concerned.

15. Grading System

Grade indicates the level of performance of a student in a course. 'Grade Point' is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a course. The product of Grade point and the credit of a course is called 'credit point' (CP).

16. Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA)

SCPA is an index of overall performance of a student at the end of a semester. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the credit points (CP) obtained by a student (multiply the grade point obtained by the student in each course by the credit of that course) at the end of a semester by the sum of the credits of courses taken by the student that semester. After the successful completion of a semester, Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA) of a student in that semester shall be calculated.

Suppose the student has taken four Courses each of 4 Credits and Two Courses each of 2 Credits in a particular semester, after consolidating the Grade for each Course. SCPA has to be calculated as shown in the example given below:

For the successful completion of a semester, a student has to score a minimum SCPA of 4.00 (E Grade). However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of his / her SCPA.

17. Cumulative Credit Point Average (CCPA)

CCPA Indicates the broad academic level of preformance of the student in a programme. It is obtained by dividing the sum of

the credit points in all the courses taken by the student for the entire programme by the total number of credit.

For the successful completion of a Programme and award of the Degree, a student must pass all Courses satisfying the minimum Credit requirement of 120 and must score a minimum CCPA of 4.00 or an overall grade of E.


18. Repetition of the Semester Courses:

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission and they will have to repeat the CE for all Courses.

The normal duration of the First Degree Programme shall be three years consisting of six semesters. No students shall be allowed to complete the programme by attending more than 12 continuous semesters.

19. Re-appearance of Failed Students:

Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students. Candidates who fail



to score 'E' grade in the ESE in any of the Course/Courses have to reappear for the ESE of the Course/Courses Concerned with next regular batch of students. The number of chances or such appearances is limited to 5 and the same have to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared.

However, students who fail to secure SCPA of 4.00 have to reappear for the ESE with the next regular batch of students for such courses for which they have secured the least Grade for improving the SCPA. Here also the number of appearance is limited to 5 and the same has to be done within a period of 12 continuous semesters including the semester in which they have first appeared.

In both cases (i.e. failure to obtain 'E' Grade for individual Course/Courses and 'SCPA of 4.00) students shall not be allowed to repeat the semester, but the marks secured by them for the CE part shall be carried over and added to the marks obtained in the ESE they reappear. However, those who fail in the CE (i.e. those who fail to secure a minimum of 'E' grade) will have one chance to improve the same (except the marks for attendance) along with next regular batch of students.

20. Improvement of ESE

Candidates who have successfully completed the semester, but wish to improve their marks for the ESE shall have only one chance for the same along with the next immediate regular batch of students. In this case, the better marks obtained shall be considered for the calcualtion of SCPA.

21. Grace Marks

Grace Marks shall be awarded for Sports/Arts/NCC/NSS in recognition of meritorious achievemements.

GOOD MANNERS AND CONDUCT ON THE CAMPUS

- 1. When a student meets a member of the teaching staff of the college inside the campus or outside, it is a matter of politeness that he/she should greet the teacher.
- 2. When a teacher enters the class, the students must keep standing, until the teacher has permitted them to sit down or he/she occupies his/her seat.



SCHEDULE OF FEE FOR DEGREE COURSE

MORNING PRAYER AND CLASS HOURS

At the commencement of classes in the morning, the 'Daiva Dasakam' (prayer of humanity) is played on the public address system. Staff and students stand in reverential silence during its soothing and melodious rendering. The class hours are from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. The college office functions from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

The college works under the full day system with two sessions. In between the two sessions there will be a noon interval of forty five minutes from 1 p.m. to 1.45 p. m. Besides Lecture classes, there will be Seminars, Tutorials, Group discussions and Counselling.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. The teacher will mark attendance at the beginning of the period.
- 2. A student who is not in the class when the attendance is taken shall be marked absent.
- 3. A teacher shall however mark a student coming late present after dealing with him/her as he/she thinks fit. At the end of each term or at the beginning of the following term, a list will be put up on the General Notice Board, showing the number of days of attendance lost by each student till then.
- 4. Absence from class for an hour will be considered as absence for the concerned session.
- 5. The annual Certificate for Attendance and Progress required for promotion and for admission to the University Examination will not be granted unless.
- a. The student should have atleast 75% of the attendance prescribed by the University for the course.
- b. The student should complete the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the authorities.
- c. His/her progress in studies and conduct should be satisfactory.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Students undergoing the Semester System will have to remit fees at the beginning of each Semester. Special fees will be collected at the beginning of the academic year.

Those who fail to remit the fee even after the publication of the list will be removed from the rolls and a readmission fee of Rs. 50/- with fee and fine will be collected from them.

GENERAL LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

- All students of the college are members of the Library and Reading room. The library will remain open on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.
- Silence shall be strictly observed in the Library, Reading Room and its premises.
- Books will be issued only on production of identity cards.
- Books in the reference section will not be lent out. They may be referred inside the library hall.
- ✤ A student is permitted to borrow only one book at a time.
- Students are not allowed to keep the borrowed book for more than ten days.
- Failure to return a book on the due date entails a fine of 1 rupee per day.
- Books taken for the vacation shall be returned within the first three working days, after reopening.
- A student against whom any charge is outstanding will not be allowed to borrow books from any library.
- Marking, underlining, tearing of pages or damaging of any book or manuscript will invite severe punishment.
- While borrowing book students shall bring to the notice of the librarian the damages if any in the book, otherwise they will be held responsible for such damages.
- Compensation for books lost or in any way damaged must be paid according to the librarian's estimate of their value.
- No newspaper or periodical should be taken out of the reading room.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

- 1. Examination will be held at the end of each term for all classes. No student is permitted to absent himself/herself from the examinations without the permission of the Principal.
- 2. Class tests will be held from time to time.
- 3. A progress report of each student will be sent to his/her guardian at the end of the examinations. They are to be returned to the Principal within a week with the signature of the guardian.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

With a view to comprehensively improving the all round performance of student and providing greater opportunities for the personal rapport between the teacher and the taught, the tutorial system has been introduced. Each class will be under the charge of a teacher of the respective dept. designated as **'Group Tutor'**

Each Group Tutor will regularly monitor the progress and conduct of the group and generally advise them on avenues of academic improvement.

Leave of absence of students will be granted only if the applications are recommended and forwarded by the group tutor. No conduct certificate will ordinarily be issued to a student except on the recommendation of the Group Tutor

MEDICAL INSPECTION

All students of I year degree, III year Degree and I year PG of the colleges have to undergo a medical examination during the first term of the academic session to diagonose diseases and who are called upon to undergo treatment shall do so. Those who are suffering from contagious diseases will not be allowed to attend classes till they are completely cured, and a certificate to that effect to be produced from a recognized Medical Officer.

RESIDENCE OF STUDENTS

All Students who do not reside with their parents or guardians shall reside in lodging approved by the Principal. Change in residence should be reported immediately to the Principal.

EXCURSION, PICNICS AND STUDY TOUR

- Students are not permitted to organize or conduct excursions or picnic without the knowledge and consent of the class teacher concerned.
- 2. Study tours will be organized by the respective Departments.
- 3. Only final year students (III DC, Final P.G.) will be permitted to go on excursions and tours.
- 4. Written consent in the prescribed form should be obtained from the guardians by all students going on excursion.
- 5. A detailed programme of travel, stay, places of visit, names of participants etc; should be submitted to the principal before proceeding on a tour or excursion.
- 6. No student from one class will be permitted to join another class going on excursion.
- 7. There should be at least two teachers (one male and one female) to accompany each team.

PARENT - TEACHER ASSOCIATION

- 2. If the Caution deposit is less than the amount to be realized from the student, the excess amount will be realized by other means as the principal may decide.
- 3. Every student should get his/her caution deposit refunded after the completion of the course. In case of a student not availing the refund even after two months the name of the student will be notified in the Gazette and if he/she fails to accept the amount within the period notified by the Principal the whole amount due to the student will be credited to the Government.
